### SUBJECT TO AUDIT

### TREASURER'S REPORT

This year has in many ways again been quite satisfactory from the financial viewpoint. The surplus on the General Fund for the year has been maintained at  $\mathfrak{L}100$  despite the transfer of  $\mathfrak{L}75$  to the Handbell Fund; as a result the accumulated surplus continues to grow towards an adequate balance.

Membership levels have declined by a net 5% during 1983 although a detailed examination of the individual entries shows significant additions and deletions. The number of recruits who leave the ringing exercise in any year means that we must continue to recruit significant numbers of new members to the Guild if our membership is not to drop. The number of covenanted subscriptions continues to be disappointing; although this year showed an encouraging increase, and the resulting extra income from the Inland Revenue offset the loss from the lower membership. The unclaimed tax rebate on uncovenanted subscriptions amounts to about \$400 each year.

Donations have been made as usual to the Friends of the Cathedral, the Friends of St. Peter's Sudbury and the Suffolk Historic Churches Trust. The Guild's insurance policy continues to provide cover for third party liability for all members, the Guild's assets [handbells, shields, master's badge and library], and the personal accident cover for the members of the maintenance committee.

This year two small grants have been promised from the Restoration Fund. It should perhaps be noted that there was no specific fund raising for restoration during 1982 or 1983 however, the fund income has maintained its level. The figures for interest earnt this year include 13 months interest on the deposits at the Central Board of Finance of the Church of England.

An examination of the Technical Advisers report will show the need for restoration work in Suffolk. Suffolk is almost unique in the scale of this need for restoration and this is one reason why your decision in the early 1970's to allocate half the subscription income to the Restroration Fund was so far-sighted.

Last year it was decided to transfer, from 1983 onwards, annually £75 from the General Fund to the Handbell Restoration Fund to start on the restoration of our sets of handbells. The Fund has also been swelled this year by sponsorship of members from Rushmere, Henley, and Debenham on the Orwell Walk, and by donations in memory of David Tovell. As a result the balance on the fund now represents about half the cost of the work required to the main set.

### Ringing Master's Report For 1983

If 1982 was the year of the Doubles, what can I say about 1983? A new Doubles record set -151 methods and a silent and non-conducted peal of 42 methods/variations. My congratulations to both bands.

1983 was a special year for me. The year in which I was elected Master and the year in which I was married. I hope that I performed both duties satisfactorily.

The week after my election was of course the Guild Diamond Anniversary Dinner at Ipswich Town Hall. This was a wonderful occasion enjoyed by about a hundred of our members, including three of the Founder Members.

As I write the senior member of the trio – George Finch – is in hospital recovering from illness and struggling to regain mobility. I am sure that we all extend our best wishes to our oldest member.

The Guild Dinner signalled the start of Peal Week during which 16 peals were rung. Many firsts were scored, including a peal of Suffolk Surprise Major.

The main event of May was the Striking Competition. The number of teams in both the six bell competition at Cavendish and the eight bell competition at Clare, was disappointing but perhaps the location did not help. In any event it was an enjoyable day with St. Mary le Tower just pipping Clare to the post in the six bell and the South East District winning the eight bell. My congratulations to all teams for participating. Let us hope that this year more teams will compete to make 1984 an even more enjoyable occasion.

In September I arranged an outing to London. Forty-one people came for what turned out to be an extremely good day, with only one slight hitch at St. Olaves, Hart Street. I am currently arranging a further outing for April 14th. 1984. Hopefully by the time you read this many of you will have enjoyed another fine day out.

October is the month of the Guild Training Day. This year's was again successful thanks to the hard work of Amanda Whiting. This day is my favourite day of the year. I urge everybody to consider the type of courses they require and let me or your District Ringing Master know as soon as possible so that we can get as many courses as possible arranged.

1983 was a good year for peals – 149 being scored. My congratulations to first pealers: Helen Leeson, Kate Moore, Kathleen Bellman, David Bellman, Tanya Ellis, Tracey Connolly, Tom Stevenson, Joy Hammond, Ralph Earey, Dawn Earey, Kim Doggett, John Riley, David Webb, Richard Rapier, David Hughes, and Julie Burgess. First conductors were James Smith and Simon Curl. Anniversaries of first peals were also recorded – Janice Baldry (10th with the same band as the original), Ernest Pearse (50th.) and Leslie Brett (60th.) Other personal achievements are worthy of mention: Michael Whitby – 100th. for the Guild, Martin Thorley – 250th. as conductor for the Guild, Roger Peters – 250th. peal, Peter Archer – 250th. for the Guild, Simon Rudd, Alan Mayle and Michael Baldry – 300th. peal, Patricia Bailey – 350th. for the Guild and 400th. peal.

The best performances in multi-methods ringing must be the 42 methods/variations rung silent and non-conducted and of course the Doubles methods series which culminated via 114 and 133 in 151 methods. I cannot finish this section without mentioning The Grandfather's peal at St. Mary le Tower. Well done all those concerned.

Peal footnotes also indicate that a number of ringers have progressed to peals on higher numbers and of greater intricasies of method.

Quarter peal ringing continues to provide a lot of firsts. The annual Quarter Peal Week seems to be flourishing, helping beginners on to more advanced methods.

Although Guild membership has dropped slightly, recruitment seems to be on the increase. Hopefully this will continue and ultimately provide more members. The National Open Week has provided us directly or indirectly with new recruits. This year the Guild will be arranging its own Open Day and will hopefully attract further recruits.

I would like to conclude by thanking all the District Officers for the excellent work that they do and for the welcome I have received whilst travelling around the county.

### SECRETARY'S REPORT

How pleasant it is to be able to write a report of 1983 (or any year for that matter) where much which is good has been happening in the Guild. It is particularly pleasing because it was the year of the Guild Diamond Anniversary which, if we count the A.G.M. as the start of the Guild Year, began with a well organised, well attended and very much enjoyed celebratory Dinner. Our thanks must go to Brian Whiting who led the team of members who organised this event.

The 1983 Annual General Meeting was held at Debenham and following the service in the lovely old church we held the tea and business meeting at the High School. Martin Thorley stepped down from the post of Guild Master and we must record our thanks for the time and effort which Martin gave to Guild affairs during his period of office. Members elected Stephen Pettman to succeed Martin. For several years Stephen has been 'knocking at the door' of this post and already he has shown that he is worthy of members' confidence. Not content taking on the Master's job he also entered into the state of matrimony just a few months later! That job does not come up for annual election but let us not be flippant for we are, I am sure, very happy for Elizabeth and Stephen and we offer our congratulations to them.

During the year some other tireless work reached fruition and many of us were delighted to attend re-dedication services on the occassions of augmentations and restorations at Euston, Offton and Harkstead. Particular thanks and congratulations must go to Henry and Winifred Ivings for their singular efforts at Euston. Offton now have a splendid light eight while Harkstead are now a delightful and useful six. Can we not look round

to see where we can carry out some more useful restoration work?

Fresh ground was broken on two occassions with the introduction of new Guild events. An eight bell striking competition was run in conjunction with the well established six bell competition and details are recorded elsewhere in this Report. The Master organised a Guild outing in September and this idea really went well. It was also innovative in that members travelled by train to London and then walked between towers. Congratulations on a very well organised day - and it even made a profit.

The Management and other Committees met regularly to run the affairs of the Guild. It was pleasing to see new faces keen enough to shoulder the burdens of organisation for their Districts and to those who relinquished office we certainly owe our gratitude for service given. Unfortunately only two of your Council Representatives were able to go to Lichfield - Rev. L.R. Pizzey and Trevor Bailey - and a full report of that event was published, as always, in 'The Ringing World' earlier in the year. The Annual Meeting elected the Master, Stephen Pettman, and the Treasurer, Alan Smith, to join Rev. Pizzey and Trevor as our Council Representatives for the next three years. In my humble opinion this was a very wise move.

It is a very sad duty to have to record the untimely death of David Tovell. David had done stirling work establishing a band at Rusmere St. Andrew and was, I think, heading for election as a Guild Officer. Finally, but by no means least, I would like to express my thanks to all members for their help, support and welcome given to Shirley and me both on our visits and during the whole year. Thank you also to my fellow Officers for their help and support during 1983.

### **Technical Adviser's Report for 1983**

During the Guild's Jubilee Year, it was pleasing to see the successful completion of the augmentation/restoration at Euston and Harkstead, along with the augmentation at Offton, all due to the enthusiasm and dedication of the ringers at these towers.

At Euston, the ring of five has been augmented to six and rehung in a two tier mild steel frame by the Whitechapel Foundry. The new frame has been positioned lower in the tower to reduce the stresses imposed on the structure when the bells are rung.

At Harkstead, the ring of five has been rehung in the original frame built by Bowell and Son in 1899, with the new sixth bell using the spare pit provided at that time. The frame has also been stiffened by the installation of vertical tie bolts. Unfortunately the tenor bell was found to be cracked in the crown after removal of the canons at the foundry and had to be recast.

The ring of six at Offton has been augmented to eight by Taylors, with two new treble bells cast in part from metal from the treble from St. Peter's Ipswich, dating from 1902.

During the year your adviser has carried out inspections at St. Mary's Newmarket, Earl Stonham, Tuddenham St. Martin, Fressingfield, Barrow, Great Livermere and Ingham.

At St. Mary's Newmarket, the spire has been reshingled and the clock bell rehung in a new bell turret. The bell frame and fittings are in need of repainting and the gudgeon pins are in need of an overhaul.

The ring of five at Earl Stonham remain quite easy to ring, but are in need of an overhaul. The wheels are very weak and of slender design and have suffered worm attack in the rims and spokes.

At Tuddenham St. Martin the ring of six remain in good going order, but require some maintenance work to be done and the replacement of the third's headstock.

Following the failure of the tenor's bearings at Fressingfield, a full inspection was made of the bells and frame. The bells were rehung with new fittings and the frame restored by Days in 1874. Since then very little work has been done on the bells and their fittings. The bells are now in need of a complete overhaul and require rehanging in a new frame, possible positioned lower in the tower.

The ring of five at Barrow go quite well, but there are excessive frame movements which make for some difficulties in handling, which can only be reduced by the installation of additional tie bolts through the frame and support beams to stiffen the whole structure.

At Great Livermere, the bells remain quite easy to ring but are in need of short term maintenance work. The bells were all rehung by Bullock at the turn of the century and overhauled by Bowell in 1929. The main cause for concern is the large amount of debris in the bell chamber which encourages general decay and woodworm.

The bells at Ingham have not been rung in recent years, but with some maintenance work could be brought back into reasonable order. There has been some concern over the state of the tower and the resulting movements when the bells are rung. As your adviser, it is my opinion, that the bells could be rung without endangering the structure and I will be pursuing the matter with the church architect.

Movements in the spiral staircase to the ringing chamber at Bardwell will require major reapirs to be carried out before any further ringing can be allowed.

At Saxmundham, eight anchors have been fitted to the bell frame and it is now firm within the tower with no relative horizontal movement.

The Index and Directory of Towers has been revised to include all four bell towers within the diocese, making the total number of towers 252. A summary table of the number of rings and their condition is also included. Please note that this table will not agree with other published data which is based on the County Boundary.

At Copdock the louvres are to be fitted with wire netting to prevent birds entering the bellchamber and the belfry is to be cleaned out.

Ropes have been spliced at Blythburgh.

Lavenham tenor clapper has recently broken.

It has been reported that Rumburgh bells have been put back into ringing order and a band is being trained.

The sound-proofing work at St. Peter's Sudbury is still to be finished.

A schoolmaster, keen Freemason and generous supporter of our work, Jack was a man of many talents and with his brother Roy a capable handbell ringer too. It was through his friendship with Benjamin Britten that we were able to provide handbells for the first production of that delightful opera, Noyes Fludde.

Leslie Rivers - Grundisburgh

Descended from the Rivers family at Sproughton, Leslie spent much of his life in Leicestershire. On his return to his native Suffolk in the 1960's he became a loyal member of the Grundisburgh band.

Frank Sterry - Earl Stonham

Frank was a contemporary of such men as Garnham Blaxcell, William Button, Harry Lister and Bob Lester and most of his ringing was done in the Stowmarket district. He had been a member of our Guild since 1938 and in his quiet unassuming way gave long and loyal support.

### David Tovell - Rushmere St. Andrew

Sadly taken from us at the young age of 46 the Guild was stunned at such a loss. David, always supported by his wife Linda, was a very public-spirited man moving here from the Essex Association quickly responded to the new challenge of teaching a band for the restored six at Rushmere. In his usual style he gave the task one hundred per cent, the fruits of which are now to be seen.

The packed church of St. Andrew on the day of the funeral was a fitting tribute to his memory and contribution.

We also remember at this time, Arthur Peck, many years a ringer in the Woolpit area and the wives and families of all the above. Especially in our prayers as we go to press the further loss to Linda Tovell of her new born baby.

May they rest in peace.


