TREASURER'S REPORT ON THE ACCOUNTS

Due to problems last year it was not possible to include any accounts in the 1986 Report. Unaudited accounts were presented to the AGM at Grundisburgh with the promise that copies of the audited accounts would be circulated to members at a convenient time. The accounts for 1986, which have been audited, appear at the left hand side of each of the two preceding pages of accounts.

Donations have been provided as usual to the Friends of the Cathedral, the Friends of St. Peter's Sudbury and the Suffolk Historic Churches Trust. The Guild's insurance policy continues to provide cover for third party liability for all members, the Guild's assets [handbells, shields, master's badge and library], and personal accident cover for the members of the maintenance committee.

Although the Restoration Fund is shown as over-committed at 31st December, it is not expected that we will be called on to honour our grant promises to Boxford or Chediston until 1989. It should however be noted that our 1988 expected income is all, in effect, committed. During the year there has been considerable efforts for the "Friends of Suffolk Bells Apppeal", the main sources of income shown in the Restoration Fund under this heading are:-



Secretary's Report

Last year I was able to report a year of both consolidation and progress and it is with pleasure that I can tell you of a busy 1987. Though the events, activities and achievements have been of a different nature they again illustrate the steady progress and forward looking policies which we have come to expect from our Guild. Credit is due to you all for it is by constant discussion that ideas are conceived and plans nurtured to the stage where formal propositions are put to meetings for their discussion and, hopefully, approval. The most important meeting of these is the Annual Meeting and in 1986 this was held at Grundisburgh on a splendid April day. Attendance was slightly lower than usual but those who were there were warmly welcomed and amply fed by members of the local band.

Several important and far reaching decisions were taken at Grundisburgh and I hope they will further the work of the Guild in the years to come. The formation of a 'Friends of Suffolk Bells' committee was agreed and the terms of reference and membership of this body were agreed at the June Management Committee meeting. Nothing much appears to have happened because representatives from each District had to be elected to serve and this, of course, was a slow process. I trust that things will now begin to happen. The Treasurer's Report and audited accounts were, unfortunately, not available at the AGM but the accounts were duly audited in May and steps have now been taken to try to ensure that in the future all the relevant information and cash are received by the Treasurer to enable him to complete his report and accounts in time for publication in the Annual Report, Various additions and ammendments to the Constitution and Rules were made, the purposes of which were to remove anomolies and to allow for the more efficient operation of management affairs. The facility to establish further such sub-committees as the management Committee may deem necessary needs additional wording to the effect that the terms of reference of these sub-committees will need to be determined by the Management Committee before the Charity Commission will accept the change and this will be put before the 1988 AGM. A new set of Striking Competition rules was agreed and this particularly formalises the eight bell competition and unites the two competitions under one set of rules. The idea that all people who ring peals for the Guild should be encouraged to contribute to Church funds in recognition of the enjoyment they derive from their activity was discussed both at the AGM and by the Management Committee and finally at the Tower Captains' Seminar from where the results of their deliberations are awaited. This seminar was a new venture move at Grudisburgh to raise peal fees and to thus contribute more to restoration work but this good idea was thwarted by regulations later to be 'got round' by the Management Committee so that the original aim was achieved and out of a 60p rope fee per ringer, 40p will now go to restoration funds.

Most of the Guild Officers were re-elected but Mrs S. Girt, N.F. Whittell and R.A. Knight, not seeking nomination were replaced by Mrs Angela Harris as Newsletter Editor, Mrs Amanda Whiting as one of the Handbell Trustees and Ralph Earey as Maintenance Officer. We thank the retiring Officers for all they have done for the Guild. Mrs P. Bailey and Mrs S. Girt were elected Vice Presidents of the Guild and Mrs W. Lockwood was elected to Life Honorary Membership. Your Central Council representatives attended the meeting in Coventry with Rev. L.R. Pizzey being elected to serve on the Peals Analysis committee and A.R. Smith being re-elected to the Bell Restoration Funds committee. S.D. Pettman was nominated for the Education committee but unfortunately was not successful in the elections. Management Committee meetings have been regularly held and attendance has been good. I hope that the discussions and decisions have been reported to you at your District meetings. Perhaps the October meeting was notable in that virtually all members attended even though it was only a day after the severe storms and it must surely be the first to have been conducted by candlelight!

Guild meetings also have the very pleasant social aspect of the gatherings and this report must include the very enjoyable London Outing again superbly organised by the Master; the various very successful exhibitions/open days held in the Districts during August and the enjoyable and amusing end to the Training Day when an Inter District Quiz saw the North West District failing to keep up with the South East District who were able to correctly answer more brain teasers than the other Districts. Our thanks to the Recruitment and Training Committee for their organisation of this event

It is with regret and sadness that I have to report the loss of some of the stalwart members of the Guild whose obituaries are recorded elsewhere. Their efforts on our behalf will long be remembered and our sympathy is extended to their families.

Having had much to report this year I must not fail to offer my sincere thanks to my fellow Officers

for their support and help; to the District Officers for similarly being of considerable assistance and to you all for the genuine and sincere welcome which has been accorded to Shirley and I as we have visited your District meetings.

Technical Adviser's Report

The past year has been a quiet one with regard to restorations but there has still been a considerable amount of effort which should bear fruit in the near future.

One such example is at Walsham le Willows where the six bells were dismantled and sent to the foundry in November. This ring will be rehung in the existing frame in the early part of 1988.

At Monewden the six bells are now ringable for special occasions due in no small part to the efforts of Ralph Earey and Stephen Pettman.

Another tower where ringing is now possible is Stansfield, following restoration work on the tower and the fourth bell being roped on the opposite side. Outstanding restoration work on the tower means that ringing is restricted to special occasions with no peal attempts.

During 1987 inspections have been carried out at Ipswich, St. Margarets; Haverhill; Bramfield; Lt. Waldingfield; Southwold; Metfield; Baylham and Lakenheath.

At St. Margarets Ipswich, additional beams have been inserted beneath the frame between the existing beams to stiffen the supports to the frame. The pulleys have been overhauled and the bearings repacked, which has gone a long way to improving the 'go' of these bells.

The ring of six at Haverhill requires some short term maintenance work with the main cause for concern being the state of the clapper joints. These are of a poor design which requires the clapper and staple to be sent to the foundry for new joints to be fitted.

At Bramfield consideration is being given to the installation of a concrete ring beam to hold the four quadrants of the tower together. Once this has been done, together with the regrouting of any loose flints, it would be possible for the bells to be rung again.

The fittings of the bells at Lt. Waldingfield are much decayed, such to the extent that despite refurbishment of the tower walls, the bells will require a complete rehanging before they can be rung.

The eight bells at Southwold are generally in a good condition but some short term maintenance work is required. These bells were last rehung in 1931 by Alfred Bowell whereas the oak bellframe was installed by George Day & Son of Eye in 1897. The tower is in good condition although the copper roofing was blown off in the great October storm.

At Metfield the ring of three is hung for swing chiming. There is now some local interest in restoring and augmenting the bells which would be a considerable task for such a small parish.

The tower at Baylham has been repointed and a new roof installed which will prevent the further ingress of rainwater into the bell chamber. The parish are hoping to do some minor work to keep the bells ringable but at present are unable to comtemplate a full restoration, their next priority being the nave roof.

At Lakenheath the bells can be rung again following repairs to the top of the tower, however on the debit side West Stow are now unringable due to the structural condition of the tower. Some immediate repairs have been carried out but it will be some time before the parish can raise the necessary funds to complete the work.

Ringing at Wickham Market is also restricted as a result of cracks in the base of the tower. It would appear that these cracks are due to weak foundations and not to the ringing of the bells. The situation will continue to be monitored.

At Lavenham the noise of the bells in the ringing chamber has been reduced by the fixing of additional boarding between the chamber and the bells. Thanks are due to Ronald Clouston for carrying out this work.

During the year I have represented the Guild at two Central Council Seminars. The first being on the subject of Bell Restoration Funds at Northampton and the second was for Bell Advisers at Coventry.

The observant will notice an increase in the total number of towers in the Summary. This is because of the inclusion of Combs and Darsham, both four bell towers, but unringable at the present time. Overall there has been very little change in the total number of unringable bells.

Maintenance Officer's Report 1987

Again we have had a busy year on the maintenance front. Various works have been carried out by members of the Maintenance Committee, ringers and local parishioners. Unfortunately the majority of problems in our Church bell towers are caused by the weather and birds, each causing deterioration of timber and metal. One or two birds can cause a lot of mess in a couple of days and can soon affect the 'go' of the bells by blocking rope holes and jamming pulleys, either with excrement or corpses, but prevention is always better than cure. It is therefore recommended that the openings in the bell chambers are closed with plastic or wire netting. Five minutes spent fixing wire netting is preferable to five days clearing out bird excrement! I am sure that a lot of people know of a tower which has birds getting inside it, either their local tower or a tower in their district. If this is the case and you haven't the time, netting or equipment to prevent the birds gaining access, or you know of any other maintenance problem, please contact a representative from the Maintenance Committee so that we can help solve the problem.

How nice it was to see the S.E. Ringing Master initiating a rope pool for the mutual benefit of all the towers in the district. Other districts please take note!

The towers that have featured in the three committee meetings are listed below:-

Barking - The Ellacombe mechanism has been repaired.

Baylham - The storm damage to the tower has been repaired. The bells are now ringable, but odd repairs are still needed.

Blythburgh - The broken third clapper has been repaired at Whitechapel.

Bredfield - After discovering that the gudgeon pins were broken on the second, a pair of new pins have been fitted by Taylors.

Bungay - The bells are now ringable after volounteers cleaned out the tower and carried out odd repairs.

Buxhall - The frame has been painted.

Darsham - The four bells have been inspected and briefly rung. Repairs to the frame need to be completed before the bells are rung on a regular basis.

Debenham - A seized pulley has been freed.

East Bergholt - The clappers have been rebushed.

Heveningham - The bells have been inspected and a rope spliced.

Hintlesham - The bells have received various repairs including some painting of the frame and fittings.

Hollesley - The 'toggle' part of the Hasting stay has been replaced as the old toggle broke due to corrosion.

Ipswich, St. Clement - The South side louvre netting has been repositioned after it was blown down in the wind. The tower is now bird free but requires cleaning.

Ipswich, St. Margaret - The bells have received a lot of attention from their new Tower Captain, including the cleaning and regreasing of both the bearings and the pulleys, the replacement of the clapper rubbers and the addition of an extra pulley on the treble.

Ipswich, St. Mary-le-Tower - An odd knocking noise has been cured by a piece being cut off the second's clapper flight.

Ipswich, St. Nicholas - The almost non-existant wire netting has been replaced with plastic netting and the whole tower has been cleaned out.

Leiston - The clapper of the fourth has been rebushed.

Long Melford - Various maintenance work has been carried out.

Monewden - The bells are now ringable after a wheel was fitted to the fifth bell, other wheels repaired and adjustments made to the frame.

Stansfield - The bells are now ringable for short periods until further strengthening of the tower is completed.

Stonham Aspal - The seventh bell has been tightened onto the headstock.

The Inetham - The cracked fourth bell has been replaced by a bell from Whitechapel.

Tunstall - The rope guides have been repaired.

Walsham le Willows - The bells have been removed for rehanging.

The following towers have been inspected and are awaiting maintenance:- Copdock, Cotton, Little Waldingfield.

The following towers have shown interest in partial or complete restoration:- Boxford, Chediston, Clopton, Hoxne, Wisset.

Ringing Master's Report

1987 was a quiet year in terms of major events but we can hopefully look forward to a little more excitement during 1988 - the 65th anniversary of the Guild. There is still the very real prospect of seeing some major restorations and there is to be an anniversary dinner. 'Friends of Suffolk Bells' has not really taken off yet, but with the new committee having been set up, 1988 could well prove to be a successful year in this respect.

Returning to 1987, I wish to place on record brief details of Guild events.

The Guild outing was held this year in March and again we visited London. Towers visited were St. Luke, Chelsea (10), Chelsea Old Church (8), Chiswick (8), Acton (8) and St. Mary-le-Bow (12). As usual this event was well supported.

The striking competitions were held at Hintlesham and Kersey respectively. St. Mary-le-Tower, lpswich won both competitions.

The public relations day was held in August. Successful exhibitions took place at Bury St. Edmunds (NW), Kersey (SW) and Ipswich (SE). The North East district held an exhibition weekend at Blythburgh the previous month which was also very successful. From my travels on PR day it was clear that several people had put in a lot of time and effort to provide interesting displays etc.

The Guild training day was held this year in September. Unfortunately support this year was not as good as in the previous few years. This may have been because of the earlier date which appeared to clash with weddings and other commitments. However six courses took place and those that did attend appeared to have enjoyed themselves and hopefully learned something! Due to popular demand an inter-district quiz was again held in the evening. This year it was won by the South-East district. The 1988 training day returns to its normal October date with quarter peal week following a week later.

A peal week was held during May. It was somewhat disappointing in terms of numbers of peals rung but the peals that were rung included several firsts. Another peal week is planned next year-it would be nice to see more peals across the county.

At the time of writing, the peal total looks likely to exceed 150. This is a remarkable number for what in terms of membership is quite a small Guild.

First pealers from peals published to date include:-

Persephone Booth, Stephen Claridge, Yvonne Cole, Penelope Davey, Mary Garner, Shirley Girt, Mark Glasswell, Carol Griffin, Tanya Grisby, Carol and Samantha Hall, David Hallett, Claire and Geoffrey Haynes, Damon Lyall, Elizabeth Parker, Peter Rothwell, Julian Thompson, Benedict, Gillian and Molly Waterson.

Two members called their first peal in 1987, both are notable achievements:- Katharine Whittell aged 13 called a peal of Bob Major and Owen Claxton called Stedman Triples.

Personal milestones have as usual been achieved, notably:-

50th peal - Adrian Blumfield, Simon Girt: 100th peal - Josephine Beever, Andrew Fisk, Chris Nunn: 200th peal - John Girt, Trevor Hughes, James Smith: 300th peal - Michael Whitby: 500th peal-Simon Rudd: 600th peal - Pat Bailey: 750th peal - Trevor Bailey: 2000th peal - Martin Thorley: 50th as conductor - James Smith.

Peals for the Guild:-

150th - David Salter, James Smith: 200th - David Salter, Michael Whitby: 300th - Harry Archer, Peter Mayle: 350th - Michael Baldry: 500th - Pat Bailey: 50th as conductor - David Salter.

It is also interesting to note that co-incidently both James Smith and Mike Whitby achieved personal and Guild milestones together, James - 200th peal and 150th for the Guild at St. Mary-le-Tower: Mike - 300th peal and 200th for the Guild at Framlingham.

Robin and Mary Allum rang their 200th peal together. Another interesting 'together' peal involving families was at East Harling where Pat and Trevor Bailey and Alan and Peter Mayle rung their 100th together as a foursome.

There have been several peals worthy of note which will no doubt be covered in the Peal Secretary's report but I would like to mention three:-

Cretingham (31.1.87) 42 methods doubles.

Hasketon (15.3.87) 210 m/v doubles - a new Guild record.

Ipswich, St. Mary-le-Tower (1.4.87) Erin Triples using only one type of call.

A quarter peal week was held in September/October. Quarter peals in general clearly help a wider range of ringers than peal ringing. It is noticeable that new bands have been strengthened by ringing quarters with experienced ringers from other towers.

Ipswich, St. Mary-le-Tower again took part in the national 12 bell competition in 1987. However the team did not ring as well as they might and failed to qualify for the final. A more structured practice system is planned for 1988, so hopefully a better result will be achieved.

One final comment from me - 1988 is the Guilds 65th anniversary. Let us try to make this year memorable and free from internal squabbles through the pages of the Ringing World. It is also the year in which I complete five years as Master and although I am happy to continue for another year or two, the membership should give some thought now to a successor.

Peal Secretary's Report

1987 turned out to be another record year with 168 peals being rung for the Guild (being second only to 1973 with 178 peals). However, yet again the success of the year has been marred by controversy, but more of that later.

During the year 6 peals were rung by the Guild outside the Diocese including York Minster, but 17 peals were rung in the Diocese by/for other Societies, Guilds and Associations.

Surprisingly, we have no first peals on the bells this year or since re-hanging or augmentation, but we do have two rare visitors to the peal columns. Monewden has been pealed for the first time for 54 years and Framlingham after an absence of 15 years.

HASKETON

12 April- 210 m/v Doubles, most m/v rung by the Guild.

IPSWICH - St. Mary-le-Tower

21 February - Bristol Maximus, by the local band.

1 April - Erin Triples, 388 calls.

22 July - Spliced S. Major in 5 Suffolk methods, first time that these methods have been spliced.

OFFTON

9 May - Glasgow S. Major, 1st in the method by 7 of the band.

RINGSFIELD

19 August - Rev. Canterbury P.B. Minimus, 1st in the method by the Guild, and longest length of minimus (5544) for the Guild.

SOUTHWOLD

21 November - Rev. Canterbury P.B. Triples, 1st in the method by the Guild.

SUDBURY - St. Gregory

25 October - Plain Bob Major, rung on the centenary of the first peal on the bells.

SUDBURY - St. Peters

21 November - Plain Bob Major, rung on the 200th anniversary of the 1st peal on the bells. WORLINGWORTH

19 December - Worlingworth S. Major, 1st peal in the method.

There has been some controversy over footnotes during the year, which looks likely to continue into 1988. It is a great disappointment that such arguments have to take place in the columns of the Ringing World, and thus bring the attention of the entire exercise upon what should be a Guild matter to resolve. I hope that the people concerned will think carefully about the outcome of their actions, both the conductor writing the footnote and the Guild member questioning it's validity.

In additioin, I was asked by Chris Rogers (Chairman, Peals Analysis Committee) to refuse acceptance of a peal rung at Stowlangtoft. The peal does not comply with the Central Council rules and therefore does not comply with Guild rules, and as such it would be improper to accept the peal at present. If however the C.C. were to decide at it's next meeting that it should be accepted then we could of course be in a position to review the situation.

Two footnotes that appear in this report are also incorrect.

Firstly, the peal of Oxford Bob Triples at Grundisburgh on May 4th was not the first in the method for the Guild, the first was rung at Debenham on September 28th 1965, conducted by Howard Egglestone; and secondly, the claim of the first peal of Bristol on Diss bells (May 24th) was disputed in the Ringing World by William Barrett who rang in at least one on the bells in the 1950's.

Care should be taken in making claims to make sure that the information is correct, especially

when it is relatively easy to check through Guild records (although time consuming)

Finally I would like to thank all the conductors who paid peal fees' promptly, especially in December. I was somewhat disappointed that only four conductors informed me of peals rung in December, the absence of this information makes the collation of peals so much more difficult. An improvement in this at the end of 1988 would be appreciated.

OBITUARIES FOR 1987

David Barber - Hadleigh

Tragically David was taken from us at an early age, courageously fighting a long illness. We shall long remember his cheerfulness both in and out of the belfry. A happy memory is one of the quarter peal days to mark the Guild's Jubilee in 1973 - seven 8 bell quarters, and dinner in the evening!

Charles Stanley Bloomfield - Henley

He was just 'Stan' to everybody - young and old, prince and pauper. Warm, generous, helpful, committed - family man, ringer, Churchwarden, Stan Bloomfield was so much part of the Suffolk Guild scene. At Henley, Ashbocking, Hemingstone, Ipswich - all over the place this Christian gentleman was always giving. And do we miss him.

William John Button - Stonham Aspal

Joining the Guild in 1924 Billy rang with the famous Helmingham band whilst always supporting his own call-change tower. He held District office and scored over 300 peals for the Guild.

Joseph Thomas Corder - Hadleigh

When the ban was lifted in 1945 and the Guild needed rebuilding, Officers were rather scarce. Joe Corder, one of a new band at Hadleigh became its District Secretary and served faithfully for a number of years. He rang a few peals, mostly on his own bells, when they really were a handful from the ground floor. Poor health forced his retirement from ringing. Joe was 78 when he died after a long illness.

Lewis Edward Etheridge - Fressingfield

One is reminded of the song of the Jolly Miller when remembering Ted, for that was his calling farmer too and a great servant of ringing in the Waveney Valley. A lovely person and what a joy it was to have tea with him and Mrs Etheridge after a peal. Ted worked hard for ringing in the Fressingfield District and when time permitted he would ring peals at Redenhall, Bungay and 'sich-like' with the redoubtable Ernie Whiting. He died in July aged 83.

Preston Everett - Bury St Edmunds

The senior ringer at the famous Norman Tower, Preston died in September at the age of 84. He came from a tough school under the conductorships of Arthur Moore and Bill Stannard but his was a proud record of 65 years there, as well as being a founder member of the Guild when it was formed from the Ely and Norwich.

Russell G. Parker - Stonham Aspal

Russell's ringing career flourished in the fifties with the Framsden band under Leslie Brett's conductorship. He was a keen supporter of village affairs, football, youth club and the like and although he never spoke of it suffered at Japanese hands in the last war. As with his life-long friend Bill Button, Stonham Church was packed for the funeral service and a memorial peal was rung for them both in October.

Richard Somes Seabrook BEM - GLemsford

One of East Anglia's best known and best loved characters, Richard epitomised Suffolk's rural life. As shepherd, woodcutter, a marvellous family man, ringer and raconteur he was in great demand and people loved his company. His ringing centred around Hartest, teaching his family the Art and somehow managing to fit 30 hours into a 24 hour day. His passing leaves a huge gap.

Keith and Palmer Whittell - Ipswich, St Margaret

Although these brothers died twelve months apart one thinks of them in tandem in St Margaret's belfry where they rang for a great number of years. Taught at Bildeston in 1920 on the heavy six, sadly not ringable now, they were life-long friends of Harry Lister, John Euston and Ted Davey. Keith, in his day, was a keen peal ringer with almost 300 for the Guild.

Wilfred Williams - London

One of the greatest ringers of all time, Wilfred was a household name for nearly sixty years. He joined our Guild in 1930 with peals on the old 8 at Grundisburgh and Wenhaston and always had a fondness for Suffolk. A thousand pealer, fine conductor, brilliant heavy bell ringer, Wilfred rang all over the world and was reckoned to be the best informed of anybody on what was happening in the Exercise! An amazingly complex character he was, nevertheless, a very kind man and he will be talked about as long as bells are rung.

We also remember any relatives of our members.

May they rest in peace.
