Foreword from the Chairman

2019 has been another busy year for the Guild with many achievements at all levels. We took the mini ring to The Gather event again in September; this annual event for young people was held at the Cathedral and gave us an opportunity to promote ringing to young church-goers and was certainly worthwhile with 50+ people having a go. A new initiative to link Taster sessions with a larger non-ringing event was also launched in September when a Heritage Open Day event at Halesworth was chosen as the 'pilot' and feedback from this was very positive. The NE District then went on to host the Guild Social, on the same day, and tested our observation skills with a tricky treasure hunt!

Opportunities for members to take part in 12 bell ringing are on the increase with more 12 bell peals but also the GWP 12 bell striking competition. Held at Saffron Walden in February 2019, the Guild was well represented by two Suffolk teams, with St Mary le Tower, Ipswich lifting the trophy and the Norman Tower coming 3rd. The Ridgman Trophy 10 bell striking competition was held at the Norman Tower in June but sadly we couldn't make the most of our home advantage; we did however attain our highest position for a while narrowly missing 2nd place by 1% (with Hertford County Association retaining the Trophy). The Ridgman will be held at Boston in Lincolnshire in June 2020 where the long climb to the ringing chamber might be a significant factor. Closer to home the Guild 8 bell striking competition was disappointingly only a competition between the SE and the NW with just four bands taking part. The competition will have a new look in 2020 in an attempt to raise the profile and encourage more 8 bell teams to rise to the challenge.

My first AGM as Chairman was quite a scary prospect I must admit but, with the magnificent organisation and support of the SE District team, I actually quite enjoyed it! I realise that meetings, be they GMC, AGMs or ADMs are not everyone's idea of fun but I would encourage you to at least take a look at the minutes these meetings generate as they are held with the aim of improving day to day issues associated with ringing.

I have tried hard to attend meetings, practices and other events across the four Districts and was very pleased to be able to attend all of the ADMs. These gave me a useful insight into how the different Districts work and, in an attempt to encourage more members to take on roles and responsibilities within the Guild at all levels, I am currently working on some role descriptions.

All of the Guild and District roles are important to ensure that ringing within our county thrives and grows; from promoting our Guild and bellringing as an activity which is open to all, to encouraging and enabling our members to broaden the scope of their ringing through peals and striking competitions; keeping the finances ticking along to ensure that we can support the restoration, augmentation and a lot of behind-the-scenes work to keep the bells in good working order; ensuring that all new members are welcomed on joining and that activities and events across the Guild are well co-ordinated and publicised. This all takes considerable time and commitment so thank you to all of the Guild and District post holders and GMC members who make this possible.

A final acknowledgement and a big thank you must go to Michelle Rolph and Mark Ogden who have produced this year's Report and to all of the people who have contributed to it. Michelle stood down at the 2019 AGM but Mark has kindly agreed to take on this role and has made a magnificent start!

Obituaries

Hubert Alan Mitson, Buxhall

Hubert died suddenly at home on 20th January; he was born to farmers at Leffey Hall, Buxhall on 21st May 1920, the eldest of three brothers. Their mother, Eva, took up the reins of the farming enterprise after her husband Alan died when Hubert was still only nine years old. As soon as they were able, Hubert and his brothers joined the business which remains to this day a successful family business.

Hubert spent his entire life working on the farm and also worked for and cared passionately about the wellbeing of the village and neighbourhood of Buxhall and its residents.

He was Churchwarden at St Mary's church for 28 years from 1954 to 1982 and during this period developed an interest in bell ringing. Hubert learnt to ring some time after the Buxhall bells were augmented to 6 in 1952. He became a member of the Guild in 1956-57, and rang a total of 72 peals, with his first being on 2 March 1957. Hubert took also took an active part in the Guild, holding the offices of Secretary to the West Central District, Chairman of the Central District and Handbell Trustee. In 1963 the first Guild striking competition was held for which Hubert donated the trophy, and the 6-bell method ringing competition is still for the Mitson Shield.

Hubert's last peal was in 1972, his last quarter peal was at Buxhall in 1998 (in memory of Ted Cracknell) when he was aged 78. Hubert continued to ring for Sunday service until October 2006 when at the age of 86, he finally had to give up ringing due to failing eyesight.

The church bells were rung in honour of Hubert before and after his memorial service by fellow ringers who had rung with him in the past.

David Smith, Stoke by Clare

David Smith died on Sunday 13th October after a long illness. He was tower captain at Stoke by Clare and also a loyal Sunday Service ringer at Clare and Haverhill. He will be greatly missed in the SW District, particularly in the Clare Deanery.

A Service of Thanksgiving was held at Stoke by Clare Parish Church, attended by over 300 people. The local band that David had trained rang before the service with open ringing afterwards by the many friends that David had made amongst the ringing community.

A member of the Suffolk Guild of Ringers for 50 years, he served as Clare Deanery representative to the SW District and as a member of the Guild's Management Committee. As tower captain at Stoke by Clare he was fastidious in maintaining and repairing the bell chamber.

David completed three peals in 1972, 1974 and 2003, all with another Stoke ringer, Valerie Jay. The early peals were quite exceptional, rung by relative novices and a first peal completed for five ringers in the band. In two years, they progressed from ringing Doubles to ringing a peal of Minor. The last peal was rung to mark the exact centenary of the first peal on the bells at Stoke on 16th February 2003.

We were especially grateful to David and his wife Pam for the hospitality they showed to the local ringers by hosting 'drinks and nibbles' parties for ringers in the Clare Deanery.

Monica Taylor, Otley

Monica and Stan Taylor came to Suffolk from Middlesex in 1977 moving into a new house in Otley, next to the church. Before long, Monica was introduced to ringing by one of her daughters. She became a stalwart of the Otley practice night and service ringing for over twenty years and was a serious student of ringing. For a time, she also regularly attended the Grundisburgh practice and, whilst there, mastered Stedman Triples. She moved to Grundisburgh in 2005 after Stan's death and enjoyed a happy last few months at Winesham Nursing Home earlier this year. A quarter peal was rung in her memory at Otley on the day of her funeral in May. The Otley band has lost a kind, loyal and inspiring friend.

Sheila Franks, Ardleigh, Essex

Sheila died on 15th November, aged 88 years. Although resident in Essex she will be remembered from when, with her general practitioner husband, Peter, they settled at Bacton, just opposite St. Mary's Church in 1960. Sheila was already a bell ringer and Peter very soon also learned to ring. At this time Bacton bells were a time expired five hanging in a timber frame which had certainly seen better days. 1973 saw the bells restored and augmented to six. This was a tremendous achievement which was entirely down to much hard work and effort by Sheila and Peter. The very pleasant six at Bacton remain as a great tribute to both of them.

Sheila was born in Bermondsey, London, and as a child experienced the horrors of the blitz, sheltering in premises under a railway arch. Her mother was killed by a bomb and she was evacuated soon after. She was also on a train involved in the 1957 Lewisham train crash in which she was not badly hurt. Sheila stayed on the scene, sitting with a young man critically injured until he eventually died in her arms.

Both Sheila and Peter served as Officers in the Central District of the Suffolk Guild. This District was absorbed into the North West District in the 1970s. She will be remembered for her infectious smile and laughter mixed with Peter's quiet thoughtfulness and also the hospitality provided when ringing at Bacton, by inviting everyone to their home after ringing.

They are both fondly regarded as synonymous with Bacton. When Stowmarket bells are restored and augmented to ten during 2020, the new treble bell will carry an inscription in their memory.

Eric Bull, Stutton

Eric started ringing in 1996 after Rev Ida Fryer sought people to take up the challenge of learning to ring for the millennium. He and several others, started initially at Holbrook, being taught by Steve Durrant. David Salter was subsequently approached by the Holbrook band for assistance to teach at Stutton. He was helped by Katharine, John Malster, Jenny and Mike Warren accompanied by George Salter in his baby chair!

Progress was slow but with patience and visits to other towers the band grew in confidence and Eric rang his first of three peals in November 1997 at Horham. In 2000 he became Guild treasurer, a post he held for five years.

Eric helped David Salter convert some old computers into simulators one of which was installed at Stutton. This helped a number of people with their ringing. In the early days he was steeple keeper, and when John and Sandra Pereira moved to Hampshire he took over as Tower Captain.

Never proceeding to much beyond Bob Minor he was nevertheless a faithful member at practices, Sunday ringing and other occasions, also participating in numerous outings. In recent years the ringing at Stutton has declined, but Eric will be remembered by those who knew him for his enthusiasm and dedication over 20 years.

Peter Hamilton-Jones, Orford

Captain Peter Hamilton-Jones (RN Retired). Born in Paris, Peter became a midshipman just as World War Two was finishing and in 1946 joined HMS Vanguard for the Royal Tour of South Africa. On the way there he crossed the equator and played deck games with the two royal princesses. There followed postings in the Persian Gulf and the Mediterranean before he became a submariner and went to Australia, USA, Northern Ireland and Scotland. For three years in the 1970s he served as the Naval Adviser in New Delhi, India.

In the 1990s he swapped a life on (and below) the waves and moored up in Orford, a stone's throw from St Bartholomew's. For more than twenty years he was a familiar figure selling poppies and helping with the Town Museum. When the millennium bells were installed in Orford Church he joined the regular band of bell ringers and was dogged in his pursuit of the art, climbing the stairs to the loft in Orford Church through all weathers. He died suddenly in August 2019 aged 91 and would have been delighted that the bells were rung at his funeral.

Janet Croughton (previously Stannard), Barrow

Janet was born at Thorrington, Essex where she learnt to ring. She met Jim Stannard purely by chance one Easter Monday, intended going to Norwich, but when the train stopped at Ipswich she got off there. That day they toured the town churches together. They married in 1955. Jim's work took them to North Norfolk but in 1963 they moved to Barrow. Jim had always kept up ringing at the Norman Tower, leading to Janet attending practice night and Sunday service ringing both there and at Barrow. She became a member of the Suffolk Guild in 1979. Janet enjoyed the social side of ringing and was a support to Jim and Paul during their years as district and guild officers. Janet enjoyed bell ringing holidays, the Norfolk and Suffolk Border ringers tours, Paul's minibus tours and numerous days outings organised by groups and individuals and visited around 5,000 towers. She was a driving force behind the Barrow bells augmentation and re hanging project and with Paul gave the treble bell in memory of Jim who died in 1993. Janet met Godfrey on day trips and romance blossomed again during Paul's minibus holiday based in Melton Mowbray 1995. Janet married Godfrey in 1996 and they enjoyed 23 years together.

Janet kept very detailed records and scrap books of ringing events over the years and after her move to Kent she still kept up with what was going on in Suffolk and it was to Suffolk she returned for her funeral service at Barrow and burial at Denham St Mary where she always attended service when she was in Suffolk.

Ernie Bishop, Bury St Edmunds

Ernie died on 17th November, one day short of his 95th birthday; he was a member of the Suffolk Guild of Ringers for 70 years joining under Ixworth in 1949. When he moved into Bury St Edmunds in 1973, he joined the band at the Norman Tower. He was always keen to help at other local churches too, especially Rougham. In total Ernie rang 18 peals, the first on 20 March 1951 and the last on 8 May 1995. Notably he rang in the first peal on the restored 10, and the date happened to coincide with his birthday!

Ernie was a very regular, loyal and capable ringer although, due to ill health, he had been unable to ring with us at the Norman Tower for the last 10 years. A peal and quarter peal were rung at the Norman Tower as a thanksgiving for his life.

Alan Feaver, Rougham

Alan was born at Rochester in April 1934, but spent most of his childhood and teenage years in Woolpit and Elmswell. As a young teenager he learnt to ring at Woolpit with friends John Wybrow and David Brand, spending many hours cycling and using public transport visiting local churches for practice nights and ringing peals. His first peal was at Rougham in February 1953, and one of his highlights was a peal of 10080 Minor at Holbrook in November 1953. After serving three years in the Royal Army Medical Corps, Alan, then living in Bury St Edmunds, joined the team at the Norman Tower where he also enjoyed handbell ringing and the "refreshments" afterwards. In 1968 he met his future wife Dorothy at a district meeting at Debenham, and they went on to ring over 50 peals together. Alan rang over 130 peals in total, ranging from Plain Bob Doubles to Surprise Royal. When appointed Area Commissioner of St John Ambulance his ringing activities were somewhat curtailed, but he never lost his enthusiasm for ringing and listening to bells being rung, especially when travelling around the country on his narrow boat in his retirement. In later years Alan was able to renew friendships from his early days of ringing and spent many hours reminiscing. One of Alan's last outings was to the Retired Bell Ringers Tea at Debenham where he was reunited with many ringing friends from the past. A very fitting farewell.

Trustees' Annual Report

The Trustees present their report and financial statements for the year ended 31 December 2019.

Charity

The Suffolk Guild of Ringers was registered with the Charity Commission on 10 December 1975, registration number 266869. The Charity's registered address is Denton House, Colchester Road, Ardleigh, Colchester, CO7 7NS. It is governed under a constitution originally registered in 1977 and most recently revised in 2019.

Principal Objectives

The main purposes of the Charity are: to promote and encourage the practice of bellringing within the Diocese of St Edmundsbury and Ipswich; to recruit, train and encourage bellringers in the practice of their art; to cultivate the art of scientific change ringing; to promote and advise on the preservation, renovation and augmentation of bells in an efficient condition.

Review of Progress and Achievements

Bellringing

The total number of quarter peals rung has increased again this year to 517 (450 in 2018) and encouragingly the number of people has also increased slightly to 383 (374 in 2018). The number of towers has significantly increased to 115 (from 97/98 in the last 3 years) with 5 of these towers hosting a quarter peal for the first time in 10 years. The peal total has decreased from 108 in 2018 to 87 in 42 Suffolk towers (and 3 out of county towers) but promisingly includes 4 peals of Surprise Maximus which were the first for the Guild since 2016. Three of these peals were rung at the Norman Tower, Bury St Edmunds and, with 11 resident members ringing Yorkshire Surprise Maximus in April, indicates that more members are having an opportunity to ring on 12. Another successful peal week enabled 3 ringers to ring their first peals, with another first being achieved later in the year.

The Recruitment & Training committee has built on the successes of last year with attendance at the Gather event at the Cathedral for a second year which provided another excellent opportunity to promote the Art to young church-goers. In an attempt to focus some resources on the recruitment of new ringers county wide, the Guild held its first Taster Day at Halesworth in September linking with a Heritage Open Day event; linking with a larger (unrelated) event proved to be beneficial so these Taster Days will become an annual event in future. Current members of the Guild have also been encouraged to make use of the resources available on the website and to visit the new training facilities at St Peter Mancroft in Norwich; this has been communicated using regular all-member email updates.

The Guild also hosted the Ridgman Trophy 10 bell striking competition at Bury St Edmunds in June. Eight teams competed for the Trophy and the Suffolk Guild achieved a creditable 3rd, our highest placing for a few years, with the Hertford County Association retaining the Trophy.

Restoration

The Belfry Advisory Committee members have been kept busy again this year with major work being completed at Hitcham, Yaxley, Cotton & Hintlesham. Much of this hard work has enabled the bells to be rung again with two peals being rung at Cotton, the go of the bells being improved at Yaxley and Hintlesham and the Hitcham bells being removed from the tower ready for Taylors of Loughborough to install them in a new eight bell steel frame.

Other projects in the pipeline include Combs, Laxfield, Fornham St Martin, Buxhall, Hoxne and Stowmarket where work to restore and augment the bells will start in April 2020.

Guild Finances

Reserves Policy

The Trustees have formulated a Reserves Policy, in which The Guild will expect to hold at the bank a surplus of approximately one year's running costs.

Policies

All money in the Guild's funds not required for day-to-day purposes is invested or deposited by the Treasurer, as directed by the Guild Management Committee (GMC). Grants from the Restoration Fund are authorised by the GMC, but are only paid after completed work has been approved by the Guild Ringing Master and the Technical Adviser. Grants are normally only offered for work to restore bells and their fittings for full-circle ringing, but may include augmentation and other ancillary work associated with any such project. In order to respond to the short-term need to provide financial support to training activities, the GMC introduced a process to enable grants of up to £50 to be made immediately, at the discretion of the Ringing Master, and grants of up to £500 to be made within seven days at the discretion of the Guild Executive, in both cases subject to appropriate records being kept and presented to the GMC. As an enabling measure, the Public Relations Officer has been given a budget, the purpose being to enable greater flexibility, and faster reaction, to PR recruitment opportunities when they arise.

General Fund

Net income to the General Fund was marginally up on 2018. Administration costs were higher, but these were somewhat compensated for by a reduction in insurance costs. Savings were also achieved in the cost of producing the annual report. Subscription income was slightly up, bolstered towards the end of the year by some members paying their 2020 subscriptions early.

Restoration Fund

At year end the Restoration Fund totalled £67,931.08, including £43,550.00 already allocated for approved grants and those awaiting payment. This leaves £24,381.08 available for new grant applications.

During the year new grants totalling £15,754.18 were approved (Combs £8,000), Hitcham (£6,700), Hintlesham (£600) and Yaxley (£434.18).

Other Restricted Funds

The Golden Bottle Trust Fund, Library Fund, Handbell Fund, Jubilee Fund, Pipe Family Trust Fund, and St Peter's Sudbury Fund all have positive balances.

Belfry Advisory Committee Report—Winston Girling

The Committee met in February, June and October in 2019 and there has been a great deal of work carried out by Members and others. Applications for Grants from the Guild Restoration Fund have been discussed and the General Management Committee have requested that in future the Recruitment and Training Committee be asked to look into the availability of ringers at a church requesting grant aid. This will include whether and how any potential new ringers are being taught and this information is to be available to the Belfry Advisory Committee Meeting advising on the grant offer.

At the time of writing the six bells at Hitcham have been removed from the tower to Taylors of Loughborough and will be installed in a new, eight bell steel frame in due course. Combs have now been informed that they can have a Warner eight from a redundant church in Leeds and are on course to have them installed in a new ten bell frame including augmentation to ten. I understand that one of the augmenting bells will be available from Keltec. The existing four bells will be installed in the original timber frame for chiming. At Laxfield, a grant has been offered for complete restoration but I have no further information on progress. At Fornham St. Martin progress is being made towards restoration in a new steel bell frame. Buxhall are also

considering installing two new bells and augmenting to eight.

Hoxne, a derelict heavy five, are looking to have their bells completely restored but this is still in the early stages. However, a local band has been taught to ring already. This has been done at Bacton and Oakley so that as soon as the bells are restored they will be able to ring them. Much work has been carried out at Yaxley, where the tenor had become unringable. New bearings and bedplates have been fitted to bells five and six and all new pulley blocks installed by the Belfry Advisory Committee. Following tightening of the bell frame these bells now go much better. The tower roof at Brome has had major work done and a massive amount of sticks and debris cleared from the bell chamber. Some work on the bells is still required, but following this it should be possible to ring the bells again. Cotton bells are now back ringing following a great deal of work by Committee members and these bells have recently had two peals rung on them. At Hintlesham the bells were difficult to ring. All six will eventually be fitted with modern self-aligning bearings instead of plain bearings. At least half of them have been done so far.

St. Peters, Sudbury has been visited at the request of the architects who are planning to extend galleries in the church which will include a ringing gallery. This is possible but so far nothing further has been heard.

Your technical adviser visited Akenham, near Ipswich to report on the single bell for the Churches Conservation Trust. The bell frame is in a poor condition for what is a relatively heavy bell and the CCT are looking at the necessary work to be able to swing chime this single bell.

Finally, work on Stowmarket to restore and augment the bells starts on 20th April, 2020, and I am informed that the bells should return in late July.

Thank you to everyone who has worked so hard throughout the last year to keep our bells in Suffolk in order and ringing out across the towns and villages.

Ringling Master's Report – Tom Scase

In the concluding paragraph of my report last year, I encouraged members to continue to support our Guild, the events our Districts organise, our practice nights and service ringing. I am pleased to see this in evidence throughout 2019.

During the final quarter of 2019, I attended the four Annual District Meetings at Bildeston, Stowmarket, Beccles and Debenham. Again, I am pleased to see the majority of District positions being filled. We rely on these post-holders to take up the challenge of ensuring effective and functioning Districts, continuing to provide opportunities for members. Encouraging wider participation from members, through, for example, proactive engagement and heightened communication is contributing towards achieving this. I am grateful this is happening across our Guild, particularly when we consider all officers are volunteers giving freely of their time.

The re-introduction of a peal week in 2018 saw a remarkable nine members ring their first peal; it was improbable we would see as many firsts in 2019. During the 2019 peal week there were three first peals – congratulations to: Hilary Stearn, Ben Keating and Sally Veal. I am pleased both Sally and Ben have gone on to ring a second peal in 2019. Congratulations, too, to Tim Forsey who later in the year rang his first peal, in an attempt originally scheduled to be in peal week.

As usual, the Guild Striking Competitions provide a good opportunity for bands to focus on achieving accurate striking. The 2019 six bell competitions were held at Polstead. It was disappointing that, although overall there was a reasonable turnout, we had no representation from any North East towers and only one from the South West. Congratulations to Pettistree on winning the Mitson Shield (by a not insignificant margin) and to Great Barton on winning the Lester Brett Trophy (for the second year running). The eight bell competition was held at Lavenham, where there were four entries, albeit with representation from only two Districts: the North West and the South East. Congratulations to the North West District on winning the Rose Trophy competition. I would like to reiterate my thanks to Sue Freeman and her team for coordinating the lunch arrangements, at quite short notice – it is appreciated. Our thanks also go to Andrew Kelso and Brian Meads for judging all three competitions, very capably, on what I appreciate is a long day of listening intently to ringing. Partly with this in mind, our Chairman, Rowan, has proposed, and the Guild Management Committee agreed, to separate the six and eight bell competitions in 2020. The six bell competitions will still be on the third Saturday in May (16th), however the eight bell competition will be held in September and combined with the Guild Social – look out for further details in due course. Hopefully this will encourage greater participation and interest from all the Districts in our Guild.

In June, the Suffolk Guild hosted the Ridgman Trophy, at The Norman Tower, Bury St Edmunds. I would like to thank Rowan Wilson for her arrangements, ensuring we hosted the event successfully. The Suffolk Guild band was placed third, out of eight entries. This is an improvement on our 2018 placing, with the gap between us and the teams above much reduced – to the extent we were disappointed not to have done better. 2020 will see the Ridgman Trophy hosted by Boston, Lincolnshire – perhaps our practices should include training for climbing the many steps!

Quarter peal ringing in Suffolk continues to thrive, with Neal Dodge's analysis of quarter peals rung in Suffolk showing an increase in the number rung in 2019. It would be interesting to delve deeper and analyse whether the number of quarter peals rung by Suffolk bands has increased or whether the numbers have been distorted as a result of quarters rung by visiting and touring bands. As has become customary, Pettistree remains the leading tower for quarter peals, and David and Lesley Steed the most prolific quarter peal ringers in Suffolk – will this change in 2020?

The number of peals rung for the Guild in 2019 was 87, the fewest since 2005. 101 Guild members rang a peal for the Guild, 22 fewer than in 2018. Considered in isolation, this is disappointing; however, the overall total is not the only indicator of success. It is pleasing, for example, to see four peals of Maximus rung for the Guild in 2019, after none since 2016.

Apologies if I have missed any.

Unfortunately, I only made it to one Belfry Advisory Committee (BAC) meeting during 2019, although it would have been two if an exhaust hadn't fallen off in Rishangles! Nevertheless, I have experienced the work BAC members continue to carry out, specifically at Hintlesham and Yaxley where there is a marked improvement with these rings, following voluntary work led by Neville Whittell and Winston Girling respectively. Our thanks go to BAC members who help ensure our towers across the Guild remain available for ringing.

The annual Veterans' afternoon at Debenham was, once again, an enjoyable event. It was pleasing to see such a good turnout in 2019.

The Guild Social, hosted by North East District was an enjoyable event, even if a few of the clues were challenging! Our thanks go to all who helped organise the day.

Let's all continue into 2020 maintaining the support shown in 2019; in doing so, we will carry on providing ringing opportunities throughout our Guild.

Secretary's Report—Kate Gill

I took up the role of Guild Secretary in June 2019. I am also Secretary to the North East District. My Guild Secretary duties have been relatively light, thanks to the elements of the role already being undertaken by other Guild officers. From time to time I receive enquiries from various bodies, for example researching information about deceased Guild members. I am very grateful to Neal Dodge for continuing to take the Guild minutes.

Guild Handbells & Mini Ring Trustee's Report—Brian Whiting

Handbells

The Guild has five sets of handbells:

- 25 bells by Taylors size 20 in C (2 chromatic octaves)
- 16 bells generally by Shaw size 19 in F (diatonic 13 + 3 semitones)
- 13 bells by Warner size 20 in E (diatonic 12 + 1 semitone)
- 13 bells by various founders size 20 in F (diatonic 13)
- 14 bells by probably Mears size 18 in G (diatonic)

The set of 25 have been used for tune ringing during the year and currently all sets are back with the trustee, with the exception of one of the sets of 13, which is in the NE district. The bells remain in good order with the exception of the set of 14.

The loan of any of the sets of handbells is subject to the regulations printed on page 81 of this report.

Vestey Ring

The Vestey Ring is a portable peal of six, tenor 8lb 5oz in B.

Public Relations Officer's Report - Neal Dodge

2019 has been a packed year of promotion for the Guild with plenty of ringing and media coverage. In February Radio Suffolk invited me to speak to them as part of a series on charities in the county. It was rewarding to be able to share some of the great things we've achieved in terms of restoration of Suffolk's oldest instruments and in keeping our cultural heritage alive. Even I was amazed to learn that since 2012 we have given over £75k towards £700k worth of restoration work, to say nothing of the thousands of hours we give each week.

In April, the Archbishop of Canterbury made a call for ringing across England in solidarity with the people of Paris following the devastating fire at Notre Dame Cathedral. Suffolk rose to this challenge and 80 performances were recorded on BellBoard with many other towers taking part. It was most pleasing to see many 'non change ringing' towers included in the list. We had great coverage of the ringing from Radio Suffolk who spoke with myself and Kate Gill who gave an excellent interview. Over the past couple of years it's been very rewarding to develop the Guild's relationship with the Diocese through their communications manager. This paid off with the ringing request for Notre Dame being sent out to all in the Diocese and getting strong coverage of Suffolk Day with an interview with Katharine Salter.

The restorations at Stowmarket and Hitcham have also garnered substantial coverage both on the radio and in the papers.

In May I was lucky enough to be invited to represent the Guild at a reception hosted by US ambassador 'Woody' Johnson at Winfield House in Regents Park. Around 120 ringers attended from across the U.K. where the ambassador spoke of the shared connection between our two countries and his admiration for bell ringing.

The Guild Striking Contest, was hosted by the SW District at Polstead and Lavenham, great locations and good weather. George Vestey, the Guild's Patron, opened the contest where he spoke with admiration of our achievements over the past year, particularly Armistice 100, while encouraging members to step up and fill any vacant officer posts. He stayed and listened to the excellent ringing and chatted at great length about the state of the Guild with those present, Guild officers and new ringers alike. He enjoyed it so much so that he stayed several hours longer than planned!

Rowan gave a super interview with Radio Suffolk in June on the Ridgman Trophy striking contest at the Norman Tower. She did an excellent job in explaining to the listeners the intricacies of striking contests and ringing in general while promoting the Guild as well.

Now in its 3rd year, Suffolk Day has certainly established itself as part of the Guild's ringing calendar, as such 25 towers rang out across the county (and beyond!) including 8 QPs and one peal. A big thank you to all those who took part.

Next year Suffolk Day is on a weekend so it'll be a perfect opportunity to host a tower open day and take advantage of some extra publicity, plenty of promotional materials are available on the website.

In November there was an unusual request from a production company to film some ringing in Suffolk for the BBC. Kersey was selected as a suitable venue and members gladly came forward to help. The footage will feature in an episode of Arena based on a novel in the trilogy that charts the life of Thomas Cromwell; another opportunity to give ringing wider exposure, plus the Guild received a donation for our efforts!

The Christmas ringing in Ipswich had plenty of attention in 2019 including articles in the local paper, and the bells of St Matthew's were even broadcast live on Radio Suffolk along with an interview with David Salter. Thank you to Katharine Salter for pushing the message out so successfully to the local media.

In 2020, the big event for the year will be the 75th Anniversary of VE Day on 8th May. Our aspiration is to replicate the ringing that would have taken place in 1945.

Thank you to all of you who have promoted ringing in so many ways in 2019.

Membership Secretary's Report - Mary Garner

The total membership by the end of 2019 was 776, compared with 756 in 2018, a net gain of 20. Forty seven new members were elected during 2019, including 9 in full time education. Sadly fourteen members passed away during the year. Forty people did not renew for various reasons and thirteen "re-joined".

Certificates recognising 50 years of continuous membership of the Suffolk Guild are awarded at the AGM. In 2019 eight such certificates were awarded.

Once the form is received by the Membership Secretary a welcome letter from the Chairman is despatched together with a leaflet which contains information about Guild contacts and the Central Council of Church Bell Ringers and more besides. District Report

2019 was a good year for the District, in terms of increasing quantity and complexity of quarter peal ringing. Over 50 quarter peals were rung by predominantly district bands, more than double the previous year's total. This includes regular monthly quarter peal afternoons (2 QPs in one afternoon) at Worlingham, and the project to ring the standard 41 Surprise Minor methods, 12 completed so far, rung mainly at Blythburgh. We plan to continue with both these initiatives in 2020. There was a good turn out for the district striking competition at Theberton in May, with nine teams, ringing both call changes and methods. The district is benefiting from the new ringing facility at the Mancroft Ringing Discovery Centre. We are pleased that several of our new ringers have visited this facility.

We have aimed to include all levels of experience in our ringing activities and ensure that newer ringers are enabled to progress. Our district outing in the spring, to towers which were new to many ringers, was successful and enjoyed by all. Again, we plan to repeat this in 2020.

We hosted the Guild Social in September - a successful event, with over 60 tickets sold. It was an enjoyable afternoon and evening, with a tricky treasure hunt round four NE towers, followed by a supper, with kind weather! The event was well-attended, and we returned a surplus to the Guild.

Discussions are ongoing about the installation of a simulator in the 8 bell tower at Southwold.

District Report

It's been another busy year in the South East District. We have welcomed 13 new members, and attendance has been good at events and practices.

- 9 Excellent. Plain bearings, modern frame and fittings or ball bearings in old frame
- 8 Good going order
- 7 Fair going order
- 6 Poor going order
- 5 Ringable if cleaned up and odd fittings and ropes provided
- 4 Rung occasionally. Frame/fittings nearly life expired
- 3 Not to be rung mainly because of tower and/or frame arrangement and position
- 2 Not to be rung mainly because of frame and/or fittings
- 1 Hung dead
- 0 Some bells unhung on the ground

Please note that the classification is based on the condition only at the last date of inspection, and any enquiries or requests for further inspections should be directed in the first instance to the Suffolk Guild Technical Advisor.

The key of a ring (i.e. the note of the tenor) is given in cents (i.e. hundredths of a semitone) from the given note; usually, for simplicity this is a white note. In explanation there are 1200 cents in an octave; a key given as C+80 could be written as C#-20m and the notes given are those of the standard equal tempered scale with note 'A' vibrating at 440Hz.

The Suffolk Guild of Ringers will not support or condone any attempts by its members or indeed anyone else to ring on bells which are classified as condition 3 or below. At these churches the Suffolk Guild Technical Advisor or deputy, and if necessary the architect concerned, must be present when assessment of the bells or tower is taking place.

Peal Secretary's Report—Christine Knight

There was a significant drop in the Guild peal total in 2019 to 87, down from 108 in the previous year. In part, this was caused by the major illness of one of our leading conductors, but also by the lack of a national impetus for peals, such as the World War One commemorative peals of recent years. However, August saw the welcome return of David Salter to peal ringing and, although fewer in number, there are many positive aspects to the Guild's peals, not least four first peelers. Peals were rung at 42 Suffolk towers and at three other venues, Saints Philip and Jacob, Bristol, Helions Bumpstead, Essex, and Histon in Cambridgeshire.

At Cretingham, the first peal since augmentation to six was rung on 21st February. Another noteworthy peal was the 5095 of Suffolk Surprise Major, which was specially composed by Brian Whiting and conducted by Stephen Pettman to celebrate the Guild's 95th anniversary in 2018. The peal was rung just inside the anniversary year at Grundisburgh on 16th March. Making a return to peal ringing after a long gap has featured several times in recent years and it was good to see this continue at Monewden in Peal Week, with Tracey and Mervyn Scase ringing their first peal for more than twenty five years. On 14th December, one of the county's most active towers, Pettistree, hosted its annual peal for the anniversary of the first peal on the re-dedicated bells, this year the 32nd. It was good to see Michael Whitby conduct another milestone peal there in November, which was the 100th peal on the bells. Another very active tower is Great Barton. The band there deserves great credit for its enthusiasm in introducing members to peal ringing. Two peals were rung there in Peal Week, each containing a first pealer, both of whom then progressed to ringing their first peal 'inside' on 15th December. Neal Dodge conducted this peal and it was rung by a Great Barton practice night band, a commendable achievement, which it would be good to see replicated across the Guild.

The year saw another very successful Peal Week. It would have been extremely difficult to emulate the achievements of Peal Week 2018 (the year of its re-introduction), when nine members rang their first peal. However, there were three first peelers in Peal Week 2019 and other 'firsts' too in the nine peals rung. Another positive aspect of the year was the opening up of peal ringing on twelve to more members. The four peals of Surprise Maximus rung during the year were the first peals of Maximus for the Guild since 2016. The twelve at the Norman Tower, Bury St Edmunds, have been put to good use with three of the peals having been rung there. There were two 'firsts of Maximus', one on 2nd February, and one on 13th April. Twelve bell peals, by their very complexity, are often rung by bands from a large geographical area so it is very encouraging that the peal of Yorkshire Maximus at the Norman Tower on 13th April contained eleven resident members.

There are now four regular peal bands in Suffolk, which have monthly attempts. Peals of Surprise, and sometimes, Delight Major, continue at Aldeburgh. The evening attempts on the light eight at St Mary le Tower, Ipswich, have a different focus. The band has moved away from ringing methods bearing Suffolk place names and is in the early stages of a project to ring Norman Smith's 23 Spliced Surprise Major. So far, 10 Spliced has been rung, on 28th August, conducted by Brian Whiting. Rowan Wilson and Julian Colman also organise monthly attempts, but their bands ring at a wide variety of towers. In all, 26 of the Guild's 87 peals were rung by these regular peal bands. Their focus on Surprise Major explains the rising percentage of peals of Major rung for the Guild. In 2019, it was 56%, up from 48% in the previous year. The Ringing World's 'Method of the Month' initiative proved to be of interest, generating peals of Cooktown Orchid, Deva, Painswick and Turramurra Surprise Major. The series focuses on musical methods of varying degrees of difficulty.

A peal of Hollesley Little Delight Major, which was rung in Peal Week at Saints Philip and Jacob, Bristol, resulted, no doubt, from the presence in the band of three ringers who learned in Suffolk. Another two young, talented Suffolk ringers have left the county for Bristol in recent years. It is interesting to view this migration against the backdrop of an exceptional year for peals to mark the 50th anniversaries of a first peal. In date order, six members, Brian Whiting, Amanda Richmond, Joan Garrett,

John Mayle, Stephen Pettman and Richard Knight are to be congratulated on reaching this milestone. With the exception of former resident, John Mayle, all are prominent members of the Guild, between them having given many years of service in a variety of offices. The Guild should be proud of the number of highly talented young ringers who have learned to ring in Suffolk in the last decade, but many have left the county now and may not return. Several ring peals with some of the most talented bands in the country, a path now opening up for Jimmy Yeoman from Exning, who has made incredible progress since his first peal in 2018. Their leaving highlights the need to invest continuously in encouraging people of all ages into peal ringing, with all the well documented benefits peals have in raising overall standards in ringing. Once again, I should like to thank Michelle Rolph, Mark Ogden, Brian Whiting and David Salter for their hard work on the peals section of this Report.

Safeguarding Statement

The Suffolk Guild of Ringers takes the safeguarding and protection of children (under 18s) and vulnerable adults very seriously. It recognises that the welfare of children and vulnerable adults is paramount and that we have a duty of care when they are in our charge. We will do everything that we can to provide a safe and caring environment whilst they attend our activities. All children and vulnerable adults will be treated with respect and dignity.

Safeguarding Policy

The Guild, as advised by the CCCBR, follows the national "Promoting a Safer Church" policy as adopted by the diocese of St Edmundsbury & Ipswich:

- Local tower arrangements should always be approved by the PCC in line with the Parish Safeguarding Policy^①. The Tower Captain should have a copy of the Parish Safeguarding Policy and ensure that ringers have access to it.
- All ringers should complete the online safeguarding training course 'Basic Awareness' (previously called C0) as advised by the PSO^② or Incumbent for the tower where they are listed. It is accessible via this web address <https://safeguardingtraining.cofeportal.org/>
The certificate awarded should be retained and the date of completion notified to the PSO.
- Tower Captains and ringing teachers must complete 'Basic Awareness' first, then attend a "face to face" half day course, 'Leadership' in the Diocese every three years^②, (previously called C2 / C3). A course may be booked at <https://www.eventbrite.co.uk/o/diocese-of-st-edmundsbury-and-ipswich-11874263047>
- All Tower Captains and ringing teachers MUST hold a current clear DBS check status IF their role includes the training of children or vulnerable adults.
- Any person requiring a DBS check must first complete a Confidential Declaration Form, available here https://www.cofesuffolk.org/uploads/Church_of_England_Confidential_Declaration_Form_Nov_2019_-_FINAL.docx

The completed form should be handed to the Incumbent or PSO for secure and confidential storage.

A ringer does NOT require a DBS check if acting in a supporting role, undertaking unplanned one-off teaching or deputising in an emergency, providing two adults (preferably one of each gender) are present, nor for transporting children or vulnerable adults as part of arrangements between families.

Where there is cause for concern this should be reported to the Parish Safeguarding Officer or Incumbent immediately^③.

Rather than talking about their achievements as individuals (as ringing is always a team effort), between them they have 400 years of membership (which equates to a lot of cash for the Guild fund) and have rung over 2500 peals for the Guild. Amongst them there have been two Guild Ringing Masters (one being the first female GRM in 1990) and a district Chairman but three of them are still working for the Guild as CC rep, GMC member and BAC member.

I appreciate that these members may not have all joined in 1969 but in the Annual Report for that year, Ringing Master (Howard Egglestone) asked members to "Support your local tower captain and back up your district officers, but above all always give of your best whilst in the tower". Wise words indeed and still very relevant today and these 8 members have certainly supported the Guild with their 50 years of membership. Subs were a bit different in 1969 though – 5s membership fee (Juniors 2 ½ s) and 6d peal fee.

17) St Edmund's Clapper competition

There were two entries this year, with the winner being Sproughton, who raised £250.00. The runners up were The Millbeck Ring who raised £50.00.

18) Appointment of Independent Examiner

Stephen Cheek proposed that we change our Independent Examiner to BAS Accountants, who will charge half of what we are paying now. Proposed Stephen Cheek, Seconded Gordon Slack. All in favour. A letter of thanks to be sent to Larking Gowen

19) Guild Magazine Team

The GMC discussed the various options in October 2018 and decided that an enthusiastic team of people would be required to restart the magazine. Sadly, as no one had come forward to take this on, the chairman suggested that this format of communication had perhaps had its day and that new and existing ways of communicating news should be pursued.

20) Guild Social Event 2019 – NE District Saturday 21st Sept

Kate Gill said that the social will be in the NE in the form of a treasure hunt around four towers. This will be followed by a sausage supper. It will be £10 a head. Members were asked to spread the word and look for the flyer on the website and email in the coming weeks.

21) Golden Bottle applications

The chairman explained that the Guild had received a generous donation which needs to be spent on training so the Recruitment and Training committee have proposed that the funds be used to install a simulator in each District of the Guild.

How to apply - Each District (through the District Secretary &/or Ringing Master) will invite expressions of interest from towers and then advise the Recruitment & Training committee.

Guidelines for applications

Members were asked to contact the R&T cmte for a full set of guidelines but ideally the towers will:-

1. Have the backing of the PCC
2. Agree to install and maintain the simulator (technical advice will be available)
3. Agree to make the simulator and bells (silenced) available to Guild members at all reasonable times

4. Have appropriate facilities for groups of learners, including kitchen & toilet facilities
The maximum grant payable will be £1250.

Jacky Savage explained the history of the Golden Bottle Trust, which was set up by her family's bank. She thanked C Hoare & Co for their generous donation.

John Girt congratulated the R & T committee but suggested that the key to training and retaining new ringers was the appropriate training of the teachers.

22) Any Other Business - (discussion only)

Jonathan Williamson explained how the SE District had used the training facilities at MRDC, Norwich and encouraged all members to go and visit the centre. Simon Rudd also encouraged us to visit and make use of the excellent facilities.

The GMC have discussed the possibility of holding taster days to promote bellringing and recruit new members. This could be linked to Suffolk Day (21st June) but this is probably too soon for 2019.

Maybe a more realistic target would be Open Churches/Heritage Open Days in Sept 2019. Ideas so far include a demonstration of bellringing + have a go using the mini ring.

Ideally these taster days would be held at key locations in each District and would be held regularly in the future.

The chairman thanked everyone who rang for Notre Dame Cathedral at the request of the Archbishops. So far 66 Suffolk towers had recorded their performance on Bellboard and she encouraged everyone to do so.

The chairman congratulated Jimmy Yeoman of Exning who received the ART Learning the Ropes Achievement award in March 2019. Jimmy learnt to ring in October 2016 and rang his first quarter peal on 16th September 2017, his first tower bell peal on 16th February 2018, followed by his first handbell peal on 11th July 2018. Shortly after this he celebrated his birthday by ringing a peal!

Veterans Day is on 10th July at Debenham at 2pm. All welcome.

Objects, Constitution and Rules - 2019 revision

OBJECTS

The Guild shall promote ringing for Divine Service within the Diocese of St Edmundsbury and Ipswich by:

1. Promoting and encouraging the practice of bellringing.
2. Supporting the recruitment and training of bellringers.
3. Cultivating the art of scientific ringing.
4. Promoting an appreciation of the ringing chamber as part of God's house and encouraging care and attention to its cleanliness and proper equipment.
5. Promoting the preservation of bells in an efficient condition, recommending necessary repairs and renovations and providing reliable information and practical advice on the condition of the bells and their fittings.
6. Supporting restoration and/or augmentation.

CONSTITUTION

A. NAME

1. The Guild shall be known as the Suffolk Guild of Ringers for the Diocese of St Edmundsbury and Ipswich.
- 1.1 The Guild shall be affiliated to the Central Council of Church Bell Ringers.
- 1.2 The Guild shall be registered as a Charity at Law (Ref. 266869).
- 1.3 The Trustees of the Guild shall be at least three members of the Guild Executive as defined in rule J13, and shall be elected at the AGM.

B. MEMBERSHIP

2. Membership shall consist of the following categories:
 - 2.1 Ringing Member: A person who can ring rounds, unaided, on a tower bell.
 - 2.2 Associate Member: A Person who wishes to support the Guild.
 - 2.3 Life Honorary Member: A Ringing or Associate Member who has given outstanding service to the Guild.
 - 2.4 Non-Resident Life Member: A person qualified to be a Ringing or Associate Member, but who resides outside of the Guild's territory and is not a member under 2.1, 2.2 or 2.3.
3. Only Ringing and Life Honorary Members may vote or hold office in the Guild.
4. Churches within the Diocese may be affiliated to the Guild on payment of an annual donation of an amount at least equal to the subscription payable by a Ringing Member aged between 70 and 79.

C. DISTRICTS

5. There shall be four Districts, North East, North West, South East and South West. Towers may move from one District to another with the agreement of both Districts and subject to approval by the Guild Management Committee (GMC).

D. GOVERNMENT

- 6.1 The President shall be the Bishop of St Edmundsbury and Ipswich.
- 6.2 A Suffragan Bishop within the Diocese shall be a Vice-President.
- 6.3 Vice-Presidents elected before 2010 shall hold office for life and shall not be required to pay a subscription.
- 6.4 A non-member may be elected as a Patron at an AGM. Patrons shall hold office without re-election, but may be removed by a resolution at an AGM.
7. The Annual General Meeting (AGM) or any Special General Meeting (SGM) shall be the ultimate policy and decision-making body of the Guild. The AGM shall be held on the Saturday following Easter or as decided by the GMC. At any AGM or SGM a quorum shall be 5% of members eligible to vote.

8. Members shall be elected to the following Offices:

9. The Annual General Meeting shall appoint an Accountant, who is not a member of the GMC and need not be a member of the Guild, to act as Independent Examiner in accordance with The Charities Acts.
10. The following Committees shall be formed:

The Guild Management Committee (GMC), to co-ordinate Guild activities and publish a printed Annual Report and Accounts. It shall recommend the levels of subscriptions, peal fees, other methods of raising capital, authorise expenditure from Guild funds and may organise general meetings, ringing and social activities.

The Recruitment and Training Committee (RTC), to co-ordinate training and recruitment. The Belfry Advisory Committee (BAC), to advise and assist on all matters connected with rings of bells. It shall maintain an up-to-date directory of towers, listing the condition of Church bells in the Diocese.

E. FINANCE

11. All money in the Guild's funds not required for normal working purposes shall be invested or deposited by the Treasurer as may be directed by the GMC.
12. All cheques shall bear the signature of the Chairman, Secretary or Treasurer.
- 12.1 Any cheque greater than a limit set by the GMC shall bear the signatures of two of the above.
13. The expenses listed in Rule K16 shall be paid out of the General Fund.
14. The interest received on the Jubilee Fund shall be transferred to the Guild Restoration Fund. The capital element of the fund shall be retained intact.
15. Grants from the Restoration Fund shall be authorised by the GMC, but shall only be paid after the work has been approved by the Guild Ringing Master and the Technical Advisor. Grants will normally be offered for work to restore bells and their fittings for full-circle ringing, but may include augmenting and other ancillary work associated with any such project.
16. The St Peter's Sudbury Fund shall be used for running expenses and minor repairs and refurbishments to St Peter's bells and fittings.
17. The Library Fund shall be used for the purchase and repair of books and other items for the library.
18. The Handbell Fund shall be used for the repair, maintenance, renovation or augmentation of the Guild's handbells.
19. The Pipe Family Trust Fund shall be used for the encouragement of beginners in the art of change ringing in the Suffolk Guild. The fund will be administered by the Guild executive.
20. The GMC may establish further funds and shall specify the aims and objectives of such new funds.
21. The GMC may transfer sums from the General Fund to any specific funds and, if the purposes of the specific funds cease to exist, close these funds and transfer the balance to the General Fund.
22. The GMC shall recommend the proportion of peal fees, subscriptions of Ringing and Associate Members and Non-Resident Life Membership fees which shall be transferred annually to the Restoration Fund from the General Fund.

F. RECORDS AND HANDBELLS

1. All peals rung for the Guild and a summary of other peals and quarter-peals rung in the Diocese shall be published in the Annual Report.
2. The Librarian shall maintain an up-to-date inventory of publications owned by the

Guild and the Secretary shall maintain an up-to-date inventory of other Guild assets.

3. The Handbells Trustee shall maintain the handbells in good condition and shall make recommendations for their repair to the GMC.

G. GENERAL

26. The Constitution and Rules may only be amended at an Annual or Special General Meeting of the Guild.
- 26.1 Fourteen days notice of any proposed change to the Constitution and Rules of the Guild must have been provided to members through the Ringing World and the Guild website.
- 26.2 Any change must be approved by at least two-thirds of those present and voting and shall take effect from the date given in the proposal.
- 26.3 No amendment shall be authorised which shall have the effect of the Guild ceasing to be a Charity in Law.
27. In the event of dissolution of the Guild, any assets remaining after the satisfaction of all its debts and liabilities shall not be paid to or distributed among the members of the Guild, but shall be given or transferred to such other charitable institution or institutions having similar Objects to the Guild.

GUILD RULES

H. ELECTION OF MEMBERS AND SUBSCRIPTIONS

1. Ringing and Associate Members may be elected at any meeting by a majority of those present when proposed and seconded.
- 1.1 A member may belong to only one District, normally the District under which the member is shown in the Annual Report.
2. Subscriptions are due on election and thereafter, in advance, on January 1st each year and shall be set at the preceding AGM, or SGM. If a change in subscription has not been passed, the existing rate shall continue.
- 2.1 No member shall be entitled to be heard, vote or hold office if subscription for the current year is unpaid.
- 2.2 The subscriptions of members elected during or after October shall cover the remainder of that year and the whole of the following year.
- 2.3 Persons in full time education and members over 70 years of age shall pay a reduced rate of subscription. Members over 80 years of age shall pay no subscription.
3. Life Honorary Members may only be nominated by the GMC or a District and shall only be elected at a Guild AGM after their nomination has been approved by the GMC. No further subscription is payable after election.
4. Ringing or Associate Members may, on leaving the Diocese, inform the Guild Secretary that they wish to become Non-Resident Life Members. No subscription is payable during the period of non-residence.
- 5.1 Any person resident outside the Diocese who wishes to be associated with the Guild may be elected a Non-Resident Life Member. A one-off subscription is payable by such members.
- 5.2 Any Non-Resident Life membership ceases if the member takes up residency within the Diocese. The person may become a Ringing Member, without re-election, provided that the person was previously elected as a Ringing Member. The person must then pay the appropriate subscription.
6. For the purposes of peal ringing, new members may be provisionally elected in the belfry. Membership is subject to confirmation at a meeting of the appropriate District in the case of a Ringing Member or at a meeting of the GMC in the case of a Non-Resident life Member. If election is not confirmed the subscription shall be refunded.
7. Any member failing to conform to the Objects and Rules of the Guild may be expelled by the GMC which shall report the matter to the next Annual General

Meeting. Such a member shall forfeit any payment made to the Guild.

I. ELECTION OF OFFICERS

8. All Officers shall retire at the Guild's AGM, but shall be eligible for re-election. The Chairman, Ringing Master, Secretary and Treasurer shall not serve more than five consecutive years in one post.
- 8.1 Nominations may be made in writing to the Guild Secretary or orally at the AGM providing they are proposed and seconded.
- 8.2 If more than one nomination for any office is received, election shall be by paper ballot, the successful candidate being the one with the highest number of votes. In the event of a tie the Chairman shall have a casting vote.
- 8.3 Central Council Representatives shall be elected, in accordance with the rules of the Central Council, during the second year of the triennium at the AGM of the Guild.

J. COMMITTEE STRUCTURE

9. The Guild Management Committee (GMC) shall consist of the Guild Chairman, Ringing Master, Secretary, Treasurer and Chairman of the Belfry Advisory Committee, and up to five members from each District, elected in accordance with Rule 20.
- 9.1 Nine members of the Committee shall constitute a quorum.
- 9.2 The Chairman shall chair all Guild and GMC meetings. In his/her absence the chair shall be taken by the Ringing Master or in his/her absence by a person elected by the meeting.
10. The Recruitment and Training Committee (RTC) shall consist of the Guild Ringing Master as Convenor and two members from each District.
11. The Belfry Advisory Committee (BAC) shall consist of the Chairman BAC, the Technical Adviser and such members as they may co-opt. Members shall be approved by the GMC.
12. Each Committee in Rules 9, 10 and 11 shall meet at least three times a year.
13. The Guild Executive shall consist of: Guild Chairman, Ringing Master, Secretary, Treasurer and Chairman of the Belfry Advisory Committee. The Executive shall take such emergency decisions as may be required before it is practical for the GMC to meet. They shall also make a temporary appointment until a General Meeting can be convened if a Guild Office becomes vacant between AGMs.
14. The GMC may convene sub-committees and shall determine their terms of reference, powers, duration and composition. All acts and proceedings of any such sub-committees shall be reported back to the GMC as soon as possible.
15. The GMC may request the attendance of other officers or members as may be required.

K. EXPENSES

16. The following shall be paid by the Treasurer out of Guild funds:
 - The cost of printing the Annual Report and any other publications authorised by the GMC.
 - The expenses of Guild Meetings (including District).
 - Stationery, postage, telephone, notices of all meetings and other incidental expenses.
 - Guild insurances.
 - Central Council fees and reimbursement of Representatives' expenses attending each Council meeting, not exceeding the second class return rail fare and a subsistence allowance as may be determined by the GMC.
 - Such other expenses as the GMC may authorise.

L. PEAL RECORDS

17. All peals rung for the Guild must conform with the decisions of the Central Council. All those taking part must be members of the Guild.
18. Conductors shall forward the following to the Peal Secretary as soon as possible and not later than 15th January the following year:
 - The names, addresses and subscriptions of any Non-Resident Life Members elected in the belfry.
 - The appropriate peal fees.
 - Compositions for peals of Triples and above and of such other peals as the Peal Secretary may request. Money received for items (a) and (b) shall be passed to the Guild Treasurer.

M. DISTRICT RULES

19. Each District shall hold an Annual General Meeting during the last quarter of the year for the purpose of receiving a report from the District Committee for the year, election of Officers and arranging activities for the year beginning the following January. Members may vote or stand for Office only in the District through which they exercise membership in accordance with Guild Rule 1.
20. The following Officers shall be elected annually: Chairman, Ringing Master, Secretary/Treasurer, Magazine Correspondent, two members to serve on the RTC and up to five members to serve on the GMC.
- 20.1 A District may elect additional Officers as required to assist in the running of the District.
- 20.2 The District Officers shall form the District Committee, which shall be responsible for the efficient management of the District's affairs and shall report to the Annual District Meeting on the year's work.
21. The District Secretary and/or Treasurer shall:
 - Collect all subscriptions and other moneys due and forward them to the Guild Treasurer.
 - Submit a statement of accounts to the Guild Treasurer by 15th January.
 - Submit a directory of tower correspondents and ringing times and a list of members to the Report Editor by 15th January.
 - Submit a statement, to the Guild Secretary, of all members qualifying for inclusion in the insurance scheme by the Guild AGM.
22. The District Magazine Correspondent shall report on District activities for the Guild Magazine, the 'Ringing World' and local newspapers.

REGULATIONS RELATING TO THE SUFFOLK GUILD HANDBELLS

1. The Suffolk Guild handbells are the property of the Suffolk Guild of Ringers, under the care of the Trustee. They consist of five sets of handbells:

25 bells by Taylors	size 20 in C (2 chromatic octaves)
16 bells generally by Shaw	size 19 in F (diatonic 13 + 3 semitones)
13 bells by Warner	size 20 in E (diatonic 12 + 1 semitone)
13 bells by various founders	size 20 in F (diatonic 13)
14 bells by probably Mears	size 18 in G (diatonic)

They are loaned to any member of the Guild whose name appears in the current Annual Report, according to the regulations relating to the handbells.
2. The bells are loaned in the first instance for a maximum period of three months. At the end of this period they are to be returned to the Trustee by the borrower and they may then be loaned for a further three months if they are not required by another member of the Guild. If they are borrowed for this further period, the borrower may be asked to return the bells to the Trustee if they are required by other member of the Guild. A member from another tower has priority over a member from the same tower as the preceding borrower.
3. The bells are the responsibility of the borrower, after he/she has signed for them,

until they are returned to the Trustee by the borrower. The bells are not to be loaned to anyone by the borrower without the prior consent of the Trustee.

4. The bells must be returned to the Trustee upon request. The Trustee should endeavour to give seven days notice if they require the bells and should return them to the borrower as soon as possible.
5. If the bells are required for a particular occasion, they can be reserved up to three months in advance.
6. The bells are maintained by the Suffolk Guild. Borrowers are requested to give a donation for their maintenance and insurance.
7. The Trustee is responsible to the Guild Management Committee for the administration of the bells and decisions regarding the bells can be revoked by that Committee.

THE MITSON SHIELD, LESTER BRETT TROPHY AND ROSE TROPHY STRIKING COMPETITION RULES

1. The competitions shall take place on date(s) decided by the GMC.
2. All Ringing Members and Life honorary Members of the Guild may compete providing their subscriptions are paid.
3. The Mitson Shield, Lester Brett and Rose Trophies shall be competed for as follows:

Mitson Shield and Lester Brett Trophy

- 3.1 Bands shall comprise six ringers fulfilling at least one of the following:
 - at least four are listed under the tower in the Annual Report
 - The ringers are a bona fide benefice (or similar) Sunday Service or practice night band.
- 3.2 a) For the Mitson Shield the test piece will be 240 true changes of any recognised Doubles or Minor Method(s). Opening rounds will not be marked.
- b) For the Lester Brett Trophy call changes of at least eight minutes marked ringing, to include Queens, Whittingtons and Tittums. Marked changes start when the first change is made.

Rose Trophy

- 3.3 Bands shall comprise eight members of a District or eight ringers representing a tower, of whom at least six are bona fide Sunday Service Ringers.
- 3.4 The test piece will be at least 224 true changes of any recognised Triples or Major method(s), of which only the first 224 changes, excluding the opening rounds will be judged.
4. Neither the Mitson Shield nor the Rose Trophy can be held by a band not complying with Rule 3.
5. The times of the draws are to be advertised in the Ringing World and each band must have a representative present at the relevant draw.
6. A total of two minutes practice ringing will be allowed before each test piece.
7. In the event of bands ringing Doubles or Triples, a cover bell must be used.
8. The Guild Ringing Master may, at his discretion, specify the method and composition which are to be rung. Any band ringing a method or composition different from that specified shall be unable to hold the Mitson Shield or Rose Trophy.
9. In the event of a large entry, the Ringing Master may choose to shorten the length of either test piece.
10. A reserve ringer, appointed by the Ringing Master, will be available at the Ringing Master's discretion, to bands meeting short.
11. A minimum of two judges appointed by the Ringing Master will be present. Their decision is final.
12. The Mitson Shield and the Rose Trophy are, and shall always remain, the sole property of the Guild, which may at any time give directions for their locations and safe keeping.
13. Interpretation of all rules is at the discretion of the Ringing Master.
